The Board of Trustees of St. Petersburg College announces a public meeting, to which all persons are invited.

**DATE AND TIME:** September 15, 2009; Board meeting commencing at 9:00 a.m. or soon thereafter, following a tour of the new facilities (The meeting, which was previously scheduled to be held on the same date at 8:30 a.m. at the EpiCenter of St. Petersburg College, Conference Room 1-453, 13805 58th Street North, Largo, Florida, has been canceled.)

Such request shall be by Petition in writing and filed within 21 days after the date of publication of this notice. See Section 120.56(2), Florida Statutes.

Any person who wishes to provide the Board with information regarding the statement of estimated regulatory costs, or to provide a proposal for a lower cost regulatory alternative as provided by Section 120.541(1), Florida Statutes, must do so in writing within 21 days after the date of publication of this notice.
