College of Computer and Information Technology	Dr. Sharon Setterlind, Dean of the College of Computer and Information Technology, explained to those present that SPC has restructured its Business Technology and Tech Management programs into two new Colleges.	
	 The newly created College of Computer & Info Tech will be comprised of 5 AS degrees, various certificates, and a new Bachelor of Science in Computer Science. The IT Security AS and Certificate program will now fall under this College. All instructors will be CISSP certified, she has several instructors either ready to sit for their exam or who are already CISSP certified. Classes for spring will be offered at EPI Center; in the future classes can be held at other campuses in the different computer labs that are available All classes will have a maximum enrollment of 24, including online classes The BS in Computer Science will have pre-requisites from the lower division classes. She envisions this program will become a Center of Excellence for Cisco 	Dr. Setterlind asked Kevin Thomas to still be active in the IT academic program. A new website for this program will go live October 1, 2010. Students can be directed to it for information on all the degrees, certs, etc that are and will be offered. IT Sec Advisory Committee members were encouraged to speak in the upper division classes as well as the lower division classes.
Database Security class restructuring	Kevin Thomas stated that many of the students in this class have little or no database experience, therefore, finding a textbook has been a challenge. Dr. Setterlind suggested making CGS 1545 Intro to Database a pre-requisite to CAP 2134 Database Security, as both classes use Oracle and SQL Server. Those present approved of this idea. New AS Degree in Computer Related Crime	Kevin Thomas is working on redeveloping an AS Degree in Computer Related Crime, with an emphasis on digital forensics. Funds for this endeavor will come from IT Security Lab fees. The Forensic Tool Kit (FTK) has been chosen because it is recognized as the industry standard for internet crime. Using FTK, students will also be trained to be ACE certified, a valuable forensic industry certification.	The physical lab will be expanded to accommodate 30 students.
