#### **Events**

- Gasparilla Music Festival
  - 1- Gasparilla Music Festival- about 12 students worked the backstage area of GMF; some interviewed artists and some worked production. We had one video student volunteer who is in the final stages of editing the content he captured. This student had a stroke post-event and has taken him longer than anticipated.
  - 2- GMF tent raised \$800 which will go towards our October 19th arts community event. This conference-like event will offer workshops that will address employment-related (entrepreneurial and/or 1099's) concerns for students and community members in the arts community. # Clearwater Jazz Holiday

• Florida Music Education Association (FMEA) Crossover Festival MIRA hosted the 2<sup>nd</sup> annual Crossover Festival. This festival grew out of the FMEA Contemporary Media Committee, under the leadership of Dr. David Williams, Associate Director of the School of Music at USF. The thrust of the festival is to provide a statewide venue for K-12 students involved in rock bands and other non-traditional or popular music to showcase their work and receive feedback from a panel of judges and clinicians. # Pinellas All County Guitar Festival SP/G hosted the 2017 spring All County Guitar Festival on Saturday, April 1<sup>st</sup>. K-12 guitar students from across Pinellas County rehearsed and performed guitar music at the SPG campus in SPC Music and MIRA facilities. Good recruiting and outreach tool for SPC Music and MIRA.

# Tampa Music Conference MIRA students volunteered to staff registration tables and a table in the vendors area of the Tampa Music Conference on Thursday, June 22<sup>nd</sup>. Students has the opportunity to interact with learning partners Symphonic Distribution, as well as local recording studio owners and engineers and freelance performers and producers from around Tampa Bay. Students also attended panel presentations on music marketing, music business, and music licensing.

#### Cuba Study Abroad

May 28<sup>th</sup>-June 4<sup>th</sup>, the SPC Center for International Programs Study Abroad Program launched the first trip to Cuba. Two MIRA students were part of the student group that traveled; they experienced Cuban music, dance (and other arts), and culture. This was an important part, along with getting the Enhanced Worldview designation for the MUL 1010 Music Appreciation class, toward internationalization of the MIRA program.

#### Radio station relocation

SPC Radio had to relocate from its prior location because of the demolition of the AD building at the SP/G campus. Provost Jamelle Conner suggested that the former security office in the SS lobby would be a good relocation venue for SPC Radio. SP/G facilities reconfigured the space to allow for a live room, a control room, and a back office/mix suite for faculty, SPC Radio staff, and students. The new location is prominent and a much improved.

#### Lakewood CD

Councilman Kornell proposed that MIRA could help sponsor a fundraiser CD for the jazz band at Lakwood HS. This was an opportunity to further strengthen the partnership between Lakewood and MIRA. SP/G Provost Jamelle Conner agreed that the CD could be recorded using the Music Center recording studio. MIRA faculty Tom Morris produced and recorded the CD. The City of St. Petersburg underwrote the costs of producing the CD.

#### New Website

MIRA has collaborated with SPC Marketing and Strategic Information on an improved and updated MIRA website. The new website should be unveiled soon, and should include new content and layout. It will be modeled on content and layout standard to music industry, specifically websites suggested by MIRA faculty and staff.
