Digital Forensics Lab Update	Kevin Thomas explained that the existing lab had been expanded to accommodate up to 40 students for a new computer/digital forensics training program. He is currently undergoing training to become a certified trainer with AccessData's FTK3 software. The Allstate Center is a training center for Encase and FTK3. Part of this process is the revamping of the former AS in Computer Related Crime Investigations.	It is planned that once Kevin Thomas has finished his training, classes can commence.
Fire Science	Two online courses have been developed and are now offered through the Fire Training Center for fire inspectors and instructors to recertify by earning CEUs.
