# ADVANCED AUTO EXTRICATION<sup>1</sup>

This extrication class will take the student well beyond the basic tools/equipment and standard techniques utilized in performing vehicle extrication. Emphasis will be placed on scene safety for crews and victims, various vehicle construction components, alternative fuels and how to recognize, hybrid cars and the special hazards they offer, stabilization techniques and monitoring, patient care concerns, and various extrication techniques will be covered. This class will offer 8 hours of classroom followed by 16 hours of hands-on training utilizing information and techniques learned in the classroom. Instructors will be Lt. David Smart and paramedic Steve Brannen of Largo Fire Rescue. Both have been active in extrication training in Pinellas County and members of the Largo Extrication Competition Team for many years.
