EMERGENCY USE & EVACUATION OF ELEVATORS BY FIREFIGHTERS

Target audience is Firefighters, Fire Officers, Fire Instructors and Fire Inspectors. Based on the American Society of Mechanical Engineers (ASME) A17.4 standard *Guide For Emergency Personnel*. Tailored specifically for Fire personnel, this program is delivered in an 8 hour module. The first half is instructor led classroom discussion and the second half is a hands on practical practicing techniques previously covered in the classroom. There are five identified objectives to the program: 1) Identifying types of passenger elevators; 2) Discuss evacuation procedures; 3) Practice evacuation procedures; 4) Discuss use of Fireman Control Phase I and Phase II during fire emergencies; 5) Practice with Fireman Control Phase I and Phase II under controlled conditions
