



Managing and Communicating with Mentally Ill Offenders



This 40-hour advanced training course will teach students how to identify managing and communicating skills for officer safety when dealing with offenders who have mental illness, substance abuse and co-occurring disorders. As the correctional officer increases skills of communicating and managing mentally ill offenders, the safety and security of a well-run facility also increase.

Presenter Steve Sampson, Ph.D., served as superintendent at Georgia Department. of Offender Rehabilitation and as an assistant professor in Georgia State University’s Criminal Justice Department. He was chief of psychology at Georgia Regional Hospital and worked in private practice. Sampson has conducted training in interpersonal skills for more than 200 agencies and is considered a national expert and authority on training social intelligence skills.
