This is an FDLE-approved salary-incentive course covering human trafficking that will benefit patrol officers, investigators, intelligence officers, and crime analysts. Approved by CJSTC for Salary Incentive or Mandatory Retraining

The course covers the history and nature of human trafficking, federal and state human trafficking laws, community presentations, the importance of liaisons, conducting investigations, conducting interviews of witnesses and victims, building multi-agency partnerships, victim rescue and restoration, managing emotional stress, the involvement of organized crime, and money laundering techniques. A four-hour table-top exercise is part of the training.

At the end of the course, students must receive 80 percent on a written test to pass the course.

The course is taught by retired New York Detective, Sgt. Tony Attanasio, who previously supervised an organized crime unit. He also worked for the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration and was a former supervisor of the Florida Department of Revenue's Money Laundering and Drugs Section. Guest speakers will provide additional information on this topic.
