Fall 2012 Admissions Checklist

Students will be eligible for the Fall 2012 entering class of the Bachelor of Applied Science in Orthotics and Prosthetics program at St. Petersburg College by submitting the following materials. Priority will be given to students who submit all materials by March 1, 2012. Please note that May 11, 2012 is the final deadline for submitting all materials:

- SPC Application
 - New SPC students should
 - Go to [MySPC](#), click on the “Apply for Admission” link on the left side of the page, complete the online application, and pay the \$40 application fee.
 - Returning SPC students should
 - Logon to [MySPC](#) and complete the “Bachelor Programs” Application near the bottom of the page. Students who were last enrolled at SPC more than 12 months ago are required to verify their [residency](#) status for tuition purposes.
- Official transcripts from high school(s) (or GED). Students who have submitted transcripts that document a fully accredited associate’s, bachelors or higher degree are not required to submit a high school transcript, unless it documents completion of 2 consecutive years of one foreign language.
- Official transcripts from college(s) currently or previously attended.
- Completion of all college preparatory coursework.
- Completion of a minimum of fifteen (15) semester hours of transferable [general education coursework](#).
- Cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on a 4.00 scale in all postsecondary coursework.
- Completion of the following state mandated prerequisites with a grade of “C” or better:
 - Human Anatomy & Physiology with Lab I & II
 - BSC 2085 & BSC 2085L
 - BSC 2086 & BSC 2086L
 - General Psychology
 - PSY 1012 (or any transferable college-level psychology)
 - Trigonometry*
 - MAC 1114 (or MAC 1147, MAC 2311, MAC 2233)
 - General Physics I with Lab
 - PHY 1053 & PHY 1048L
 - General Chemistry and Qualitative Analysis I with Lab
 - CHM 2045 & CHM 2045L
 - Elementary Statistics
 - STA 2023 (or any transferable college-level statistics)

* Prior to enrolling in Statistics for Engineers, EGN 3443 (required course in the program), students must complete the prerequisite course, Calculus with Analytic Geometry II (MAC 2312). Although MAC 2312 is not an admission requirement, completion is recommended prior to enrolling in the O&P BAS program.

- Completion of an A.S. degree, an A.A. degree or 60 credits from a regionally accredited institution.
- Passing results on designated [background check and drug screening](#).

- Submit completed [observation form](#), documenting at least sixteen (16) hours of observation, volunteer service, or work experience in orthotics and prosthetics.
 - A minimum of eight (8) hours in orthotics and eight (8) hours in prosthetics is required.
 - Hours must officially documented and signed off on by a certified/licensed orthotist or prosthetist using the attached observation form.
- Submission of a letter of recommendation from a certified/licensed orthotist or prosthetist that you have observed or worked with in their practice.

Priority will be given to students who submit all materials by March 1, 2012.

The final deadline for submitting all application materials is May 11, 2012.

Please note that the following must be completed by all students who are officially admitted to the O&P program. Additional information will be provided at that time:

- Passing results on designated [background check and drug screening](#).
- Show a valid Basic Life Support (BLS) for Healthcare Providers CPR certificate.
- Show evidence of immunity to or inoculation against the hepatitis virus. Said immunization series may be waived when medically contraindicated by a physician in writing and a release is signed by the student. In addition, students must provide verification of immunizations required by program and clinical affiliates.
