 Admission Requirements & Program Information Checklist

Students will be eligible for admission to the Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing Program at St. Petersburg College by submitting the following:

- SPC Application with \$40 fee. SPC students who were enrolled in SPC courses within the last academic year are not required to re-submit the SPC Application (\$40 application fee is waived for re-submitted SPC applications).
- Baccalaureate Application Supplement.
- Official transcripts from high school(s) (or GED). Students who have submitted transcripts that document a fully accredited associate's, bachelor's or higher degree are not required to submit a high school transcript, unless it documents completion of 2 consecutive years of one foreign language.
- Official transcripts from college(s) currently or previously attended.
- Official transcripts showing an A.S. degree in Nursing from a regionally accredited institution or a diploma in nursing accredited by the National League for Nursing Accrediting Commission.
- Copy of a valid, unrestricted, unencumbered RN license from the state in which the applicant is practicing, to be kept current throughout the duration of the required course of study.
- Completion of all college preparatory coursework, computer competency requirement and a minimum of fifteen (15) semester hours of transferable general education coursework.
- Cumulative grade point average of 2.00 on a 4.00 scale in all postsecondary coursework.
