

## Help needed to reach 'First-Generation' goal

The state has appropriated a special scholarship fund to help first-generation college students ensure their success and graduation.

Through the Dr. Philip Benjamin Matching Program for Community Colleges, St. Petersburg College will receive a matching allocation of up to \$226,780 when the SPC Foundation receives an equal amount in private contributions for this purpose. The money must be raised before Dec. 31. The SPC Foundation is appealing to faculty, staff, administrators and students to help meet this goal.

The Florida Legislature defines a "First-Generation in College" student as:

- (a) An individual, neither of whose parents completed a baccalaureate degree; or
- (b) Any individual who regularly

# Mary Grizzle remembered as a great friend to SPC

Mary Grizzle, the pioneering state legislator who died Nov. 9 at the age of 85, worked hard on legislation that has had a significant positive impact on St. Petersburg College.

SPC President Carl M. Kuttler Jr. said Mrs. Grizzle, of North Redington Beach, sponsored legislation in 1978 that allowed SPC to go to local voters for funding via a local tax referendum.

"In 1974, I was an attorney in the Florida Legislature, serving the 16 senators and representatives from Florida's West Coast, and I got to know Mary during that time," Kuttler said. "In 1978, when I became president of the college, she sponsored a bill that made history."

Florida community colleges get their funding from the state, rather than from locally-raised taxes. Mrs. Grizzle successfully sponsored legislation that allowed SPC to go directly to voters, Kuttler said.

For that, and for much other

work performed on behalf of SPC, the college named its Dental Hygiene program the Mary R. Grizzle Dental Hygiene Program in 1982. A plaque dedicated to Mrs. Grizzle hangs outside the Dental Hygiene office at the Caruth Health Education Center.

Mrs. Grizzle was the first Republican woman elected to the Florida Legislature, winning a House seat in 1963. She ran successfully for the state Senate in 1978, and served there until 1992.

Her environmental record stretched back at least to the early 1970s, when she co-sponsored legislation aimed at cleaning up Tampa Bay. That bill set standards for sewage that could be dumped into the bay. In 1987, she sponsored legislation that made those water quality standards even more stringent.

Her home county, Pinellas, fought against the strict water standards, but Mrs. Grizzle successfully guided the bills through the legislative process.

Mrs. Grizzle was a strong supporter of the Equal Rights Amendment, and her legislative record reflected that support. She supported legislation allowing married women to buy property or start businesses without the permission of their husbands; she sponsored legislation allowing women to serve on juries; sponsored equal pay for equal work legislation; backed maternity leave for teachers; and worked on behalf of legislation requiring that child care centers be state-licensed.

Mrs. Grizzle was born on a farm in Waterloo, Ohio, and attended high school and business college there. At the outbreak of World War II, she went to Washington, D.C. and worked for the Office of Energy. She moved to Florida in 1949.

She is survived by a son, five daughters and four grandchildren.

A memorial service for Mrs. Grizzle was Nov. 12.

## Stay calm if a power outage occurs

If you need special assistance, call Security Dispatch at Ext. 2560. Give your name, campus/site location,

building, room number and the phone number you are calling from.

If you become trapped in an elevator:

- Use the emergency phone in the elevator to report your situation. Press the alarm button in the elevator to notify those in the building that someone in the elevator needs help.
- Never attempt to force open the elevator door or to crawl out through the top of the elevator car. Doing so without assistance of rescue personnel could be extremely dangerous.

The Eta Nu Chapter of Phi Theta Kappa won several awards at the recent Phi Theta Kappa Florida Region Convention in Orlando.

Eta Nu, from the St. Petersburg/Gibbs Campus, won the Most Distinguished Chapter Award over seven other chapters that had earned the Distinguished Chapter designation. It also received awards in hallmarks of Scholarship, Leadership and Service.

Chapter advisor Steve Meier

received the Florida Advisor Continued Excellence Award for the seventh consecutive year.

Two other St. Petersburg College chapters, Alpha Zeta Tau from the Tarpon Springs Campus and Alpha Omega Beta from the Health Education Center, also attended the convention.

Phi Theta Kappa is the international honor society for colleges offering two-year degrees. There are 75 chapters in the Florida Region.

## Deadline to renew Flexible Spending Account is Dec. 1

The deadline to cancel/renew/sign up for your Flexible Spending Account (FSA) for 2007 is Dec. 1.

However, if you need to request an extension, contact Nicole Rubeor of Human Resources at Ext. 3204.

The government allows you to annually join/renew/cancel. Thus, if you already have an FSA, you still must fill out a form (attached to the *Blue & White*) even if you do not wish to renew for 2007.

The FSA lets employees use a pre-tax payroll deduction to set aside up to \$5,000 for medical expenses and up to \$5,000 for dependent-care expenses. All budgeted employees may participate.

By deciding to redirect a portion of your salary to the college's plan, you essentially "bank" your money in a tax-free account from which you can get reimbursed throughout the year. The money in your FSA is used to pay for expenses that formerly took away from your take-home pay.

The time frame for you to use your 2006 FSA has been extended by the IRS from Dec. 31, 2006 to March 15, 2007.

The deadline to turn in paperwork for 2006 reimbursements is April 30.
