# New health benefits package to add wellness programs July 1

SPC has expanded the health benefits it provides to budgeted employees and even more changes are on the way beginning July 1. Recently, the college began offering health assessment screenings, and making Weight Watchers® classes available to budgeted employees.

All budgeted employees soon should receive

informational packets outlining the coverage that will become

effective July 1, including the new rates.

Wellness coordinator Cathleen Shears said programs such as smoking cessation, heart health, stress management, balanced nutrition and exercise and fitness will be offered next year.

Budgeted employees also can take advantage of an Employee Assistance Program, or EAP, which offers a range of services, including:

- Financial services, including a 30-minute free meeting with a

financial counselor.

- Legal services, which includes a 30-minute free consultation.
- Work/Life services, which includes assistance on such matters as parenting, adult care, consumer information and special needs.
- Up to five face-to-face counseling sessions on any one issue.
- Unlimited toll-free telephone access to EAP staff, 24 hours per day.

During the annual open enrollment period (June 1-15), budgeted employees can purchase new disability insurance, or increase the coverage they already have. No medical questions need to be answered.

Also during the open enrollment period, employees can purchase individual or family cancer insurance without having to answer any medical questions. The insurance is even available to people who have been treated for cancer within the past year, although those people would have

**Gentle Reminder 3:** Open purchase orders cannot be rolled from one fiscal year to another. All open purchase orders must close by June 30. By the way, if you're looking for budget to get you through to June 30, balances of

open purchase orders are great places to look. You may have budget tied up that you won't actually need.

**Gentle Reminder 4:** If you received an advance for a travel registration fee but have no other expenses associated with the trip, you must still complete a TRV or FRV to close out the TAR or FAR. Travel completed before May 1 should already be submitted, so please get your reimbursement forms completed and turned in to the Travel Desk in Accounts Payable.

**Gentle Reminder 5:** The Business Services staff is committed to assisting you, so don't hesitate to call or e-mail any of us with your questions or concerns. If we can't help you, we can certainly direct you to the person that can. The Business Services Web site is continually being updated to provide you with the most current information and forms, and staff listings with phone and fax information are available on each department's Web page.

### **Safe boating course June 2 at Seminole**

The college's Boater Safety class is June 2 at the Seminole Campus.

The one-day, eight-hour classroom and hands-on course is designed for boaters who do not have time to devote to a multi-week boater course. It meets the requirements for certification of youthful operators of vessels with 10 HP or larger motors.

This is a mandatory education class for boating violators, but also serves as a refresher course for any boater. It may be used for boater insurance discount credit.

The course includes an exam and a certificate of completion, which allows boating violators to immediately resume water activities.

Tuition is \$35, which includes classroom instruction, hands-on experience, text, certificate of completion, registration with the State of Florida, and a boater ID card. to wait 12 months before coverage takes effect. This option is offered in addition to the Medical Expense Reimbursement Plan that already is in place.

Some other changes:

- The college is increasing how much it pays for each person's health insurance, from \$550 per month to \$577.50 per month.
- Non-smokers will pay a discounted rate during the next year; all others will pay the regular rate.
- Co-pays for diagnostic lab

and X-rays are to be dropped. Previously, those services had a \$30 co-pay.

- Quest will become the only provider of lab services and diagnostic work in the Aetna network.
- Emergency room visit co-pays will increase from \$50 to \$100 to discourage non-emergency visits.
- Some drugs will have pre-certification requirements; others will have more strict quantity limits.

## **TOUR OF SCENE**

Prior to the meeting, the Board was given a tour of the Caruth Health Education Simulation Center, including the simulated ambulance in EMS, and the prehospital and hospital simulation in SCENE. The tour also included a view of the new chiller plant on the premises and the construction on the new Orthotics & Prosthetics building.

## **PRESENTATION OF RETIREMENT RESOLUTION**

The Board adopted retirement resolutions for Charles L. Roberts, Provost, St. Petersburg/Gibbs Campus, and Helen J. Sivigny, Word Processing, St. Petersburg/Gibbs Campus. Dr. Roberts was present and, joined by his wife, received his resolution as presented by the president and Chairman Bilirakis. Ms. Sivigny was unable to attend.

## **EXPENDITURES AND CONTRACTS**

Approval was given by the Board to enter into the following agreements: (1) Two-year renewal with Follett Higher Education Group for bookstore management services; and (2) One-year renewal with Baynard, McLeod & Lang, PA for legal services as Board Attorney. In relation to the Follett agreement, the Board expressed concerns regarding the costs of textbooks to students. The president indicated that staff would be reviewing this topic in depth.

## **CAPITAL OUTLAY (Money that can be spent only on construction projects)**

The Board approved the following: (1) Disposition of surplus or obsolete property; (2) Certificate of final inspection & release of final payment for renovation of building exteriors – Phase 1, SP/G; (3) Selection of Griner Engineering, Inc. as the first-ranked firm for mechanical engineering design services collegewide; and (4) Selection of W. G. Mills, Inc. as the first-ranked firm for miscellaneous construction manager at risk services collegewide. In addition, following discussion on collegewide asset management and a request by President Kuttler, the Board gave preliminary approval to increase the minimum threshold value for taggable assets from the current \$500 to \$1,000, and to delete from the College's asset inventory those assets below the new \$1,000 minimum threshold as well as assets searched for but not found in the annual inventory cycle for more than the past three inventory cycles.

## **CHANGES TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES' RULES**

The Board approved the following changes to the Rules and Procedures Manual: Rule 6Hx23-5.09 Use of College Facilities. This provides for the rental of the Palladium Theater to be the responsibility of its director and site administrator, subject to parameters approved by President Kuttler. This also authorizes and limits the consumption of alcoholic beverages at the Palladium pursuant to procedures approved by President Kuttler.

## **CREDIT CURRICULUM CHANGES EFFECTIVE TERM III, 2006-2007:**

The Board approved **addition** of the following courses: FIN 4409 Financial Planning, NUR 3XXX Infectious Disease and Sepsis, NUR 31XX Infection Control for Healthcare Settings, NUR 32XX Communicable Disease Prevention and Control. The Board approved **changes** in the following **BAS** program: Banking (BANK).

## **GRANTS/RESTRICTED FUNDS CONTRACTS**

The Board authorized applications for and acceptance of grant funding (if awarded) from: (1) Cordis Corporation through an Independent Educational Grant Agreement for SPC's Continuing Education Health Program; (2) U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development through a Special Project Grant for an Economic Development Initiative; (3) U.S. Department of Defense, Space and Naval Warfare Systems Command (SPAWAR) to provide Port Security Command and Control Systems; (4) Cleveland State University for NTPI to develop online training modules covering Awareness Level information contained in the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) manual; (5) U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Office of Grants and Training, to develop and deliver Broadcast Continuation and Training course curriculum; and (6) King Pharmaceuticals, Inc. through an Independent Educational Grant Agreement for SPC's Continuing Education Health Program.

## **NEW BACCALAUREATE PROGRAMS**

The Board approved implementation of the following new four-year program B.A.S. degrees: LEED Certification/Construction Management, Bio-Technology Management, Hospitality/Culinary Studies Management, and Recreation & Leisure Services Management. Programs will be implemented in fiscal year 2007-08 upon completion of the final needs assessment.
