



## SPC gives student chance to finish bachelor's degree, despite interruptions

Logan Long hoped the National Guard would help him get through college. Instead, it ended up delaying his education with interruptions caused by war and weather.

Long, now 27 and a Clearwater resident, kept going, though, and will graduate from SPC May 3. He wasn't sure what he wanted to do when he graduated from Clearwater Catholic Central High School in 1999. He enrolled at the University of Central Florida, and at the end of his freshman year he joined the National Guard, hoping to earn educational benefits. He went to boot camp at Fort Benning in 2000.

"Once I finished that, I transferred to the University of South Florida and began studying for my associate degree," he said.

Then came Sept. 11, 2001, and the National Guard needed Long. He was called to active duty and assigned

to a security task force unit in St. Augustine.

College had to wait.

In 2002, the National Guard released Long from active duty, and he returned home to re-enroll at USF. A few months later, the Guard came calling again.

"This time I was deployed to the Middle East," he said.

This deployment turned out to be fairly short. Not long after he arrived in the Middle East, Long had to come home to deal with a family emergency. Once that was behind him, it looked like he would be able to stay at home, and he resumed his studies, enrolling in the Police Academy in the fall of 2003.

By January of 2004, he started a new job as a patrolman with the Clearwater Police Department.

But the National Guard wasn't quite finished with Logan Long.

During the big hurricane season in 2005, Long again was called to active duty to deal with damage wrought by a series of four hurricanes

## Burke named to three-year term on AACCC board

Ken Burke, a member of the Board of Trustees, has been named to the 32-member Board of Directors of the American Association of Community Colleges.

Burke, an SPC graduate, has been an active member of the executive board of the Association of Community College Trustees for six years. He served as chairman, vice chairman and secretary-treasurer before his term expired in September.

He was the first SPC trustee to serve with the national board and is the first to assume a position on the AACCC board. His term begins July 1. He was named at the national convention in Philadelphia last week.

"It is an honor to be selected to the board and I look forward to serving," he said. "I know how pivotal St. Petersburg College was in my life and I have seen firsthand through the Alumni Association

(he has twice served as president and remains on the executive board) and as a member of the Board of Trustees all of the good things that community colleges do. I hope I can make a difference as a member of the AACCC board."

Headquartered in the National Center for Higher Education in Washington, D.C., AACCC advocates for community colleges at the national level and works closely with directors of state offices to inform and affect state policy.

# Baseball and softball teams headed to state tournament

The college baseball team won its sixth Suncoast Conference title in eight years last weekend, earning its 11th consecutive trip to the state tournament.

Dave Pano, who has been the coach 11 years, guided the team to 19-6 conference record. The team was 39-16 overall.

The conference championship assures the team a trip to the state tournament, which begins May 9 in Winter Haven. SPC will play the first game of the tournament at 10 a.m. on

May 9 against the runner-up from the Southern Conference, Palm Beach Community College.

The softball team also has earned an automatic berth in the state tournament with a second-place finish in the Suncoast Conference. The team finished 17-6 in the conference and 33-15-1 overall under first-year Coach Jamie Madewell.

The softball state tournament also is in Winter Haven and begins May 2. SPC's takes on Pensacola Junior College at 2 p.m.

A health risk assessment (HRA) evaluates your health status and your risk factors for lifestyle-related diseases such as heart disease and stroke.

The assessment includes questions that focus on your health, habits and family medical history, and offers recommendations for improvement and disease prevention.

You may be asked general questions about your health, and then specific questions about your blood pressure and cholesterol numbers. The goal is to provide a snapshot of your health, and then offer guidelines and education for healthy changes. The result is a personalized health report that you can share with your health care provider.

## Taking Care of BUSINESS\$

### Travel Tips

If you travel on college business or arrange travel for others, here are some tips that may help:

#### Tip #1:

Signing your Travel Authorization Request (TAR) or your Foreign Travel Authorization Request (FAR) indicates you have familiarized yourself with the college's Travel Rules (see the line just above your signature on the form). If you only travel once or twice a year, it's a good idea to refresh your knowledge before your trip, as rules or procedures may change. The Travel Web page indicates the date of last revision for all documents, so if you haven't traveled since an update, please check. If you fail to follow the proscribed rules, you might jeopardize your reimbursement. A lack of knowledge is not considered a valid excuse.

#### Tip #2:

When someone other than St. Petersburg College is paying for your travel and you've so indicated on the TAR or FAR form, please make sure you fill in the name of the organization responsible for paying in Question 3, on the line that says "Paid by: \_\_\_\_\_." Your cooperation is very much appreciated.

### Don't miss the deadline for FSA reimbursement

For anyone who still has a 2007 balance in their Flexible Spending Account, (FSA), you have until Tuesday to get your reimbursement claim postmarked. Because of Leap Year, the deadline is one day earlier this year.

While the deadline to incur expenses for

2007 has passed, don't forget to mail your paperwork by Tuesday to be eligible to receive your reimbursement. Visit the Human Resources Web site for the claim form, which has the address for Custom Benefit Services, the third party administrator that processes the FSA accounts.

that swept across the state.

"Finally, in December of 2005, I was able to get enrolled at St. Petersburg College," he said. "I was able to complete my studies, and this May I'll be graduating."

He has earned a bachelor's degree in Public Safety Administration.

Long was discharged from the National Guard in July of 2007. He remained on inactive reserve status for a time, but he believes his military service obligations are now behind him.

"I joined the military to pay for college," Long said. "I was interrupted multiple times, so when I got done I decided I wouldn't take more help from the Army. Instead,

I've been paying my own way with some help from the Police Department."

Said Clearwater police chief Sid Klein, "We admire Officer Long's quest to achieve his educational goals while serving his country and the citizens of Clearwater."

In spite of the interruptions, Long thinks he got a great deal of benefit from the military. (His brother, Capt. Paul Long, remains on active duty in Afghanistan, where he flies Apache helicopters.)

"I think the Army is a great thing and it helped me to get hired as a police officer," he said. "It was a great life experience, but as far as getting through college it was very challenging."
