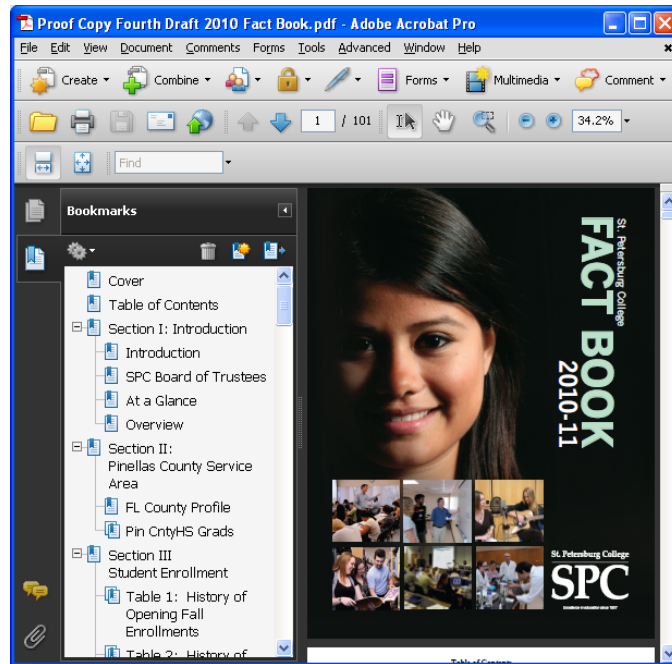

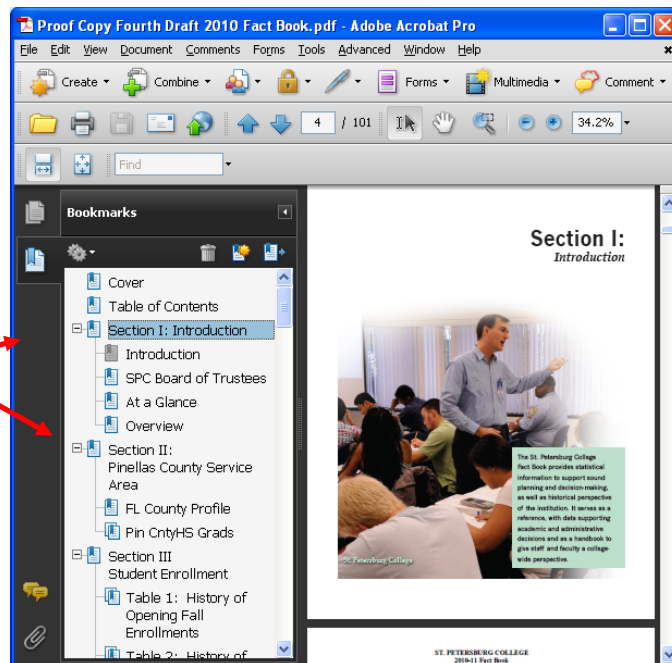
Bookmarks are available for easy navigation for the online versions of the SPC Fact Book.

Each section has a specific focus.



Information presented in each section is grouped by focus or data configurations. Below is a brief description:

- **Section I: Introduction** – General description of the Fact Book, SPC Board of Trustees, and St. Petersburg College Overview.
- **Section II: Pinellas County** – Key Economic Indicators of the service area.
- **Section III: Student Enrollment** – Demographic data focuses on one term (Fall) while course enrollment and graduation headcount are shown using a reporting year (Summer, Fall, Spring). Reporting year information is used at the state level for various planning activities. For example, FTE Enrollment information is used to for the funding process (CCPF), Relative Space Needs program, the Cost Analysis, and ad hoc reports.
- **Section IV: Academics** – Annual (reporting year) headcount information focusing on credit and non-credit programs, general and specific program classifications, and a history of annual enrollment.
- **Section V: Outcomes/Indicators** – College wide Room and Space Utilization, SPC students transferring to Florida universities, Career Placement and Follow-up, and passing rates for CLAST, placement testing, and national and state licensure examinations.
- **Section VI: Resources** – Reports on facilities, human resources, and revenue and expenses.
- **Appendices** – Information for degree and certificate programs including program hours, employers of SPC graduates by program, accreditation agencies and schedules for SPC's bachelor, associate, and certificate programs.
