Minimum Requirements Checklist

Curriculum

Please complete the following items as soon as possible and refer to the [Nursing Program](#) website for program information.

**Program begins in January and August.**

- Completion of [St. Petersburg College Admission Application](#) and the non-refundable fee.
- Submission of official, unopened (sealed) high school transcript(s) or GED transcript. Unofficial copies or official copies that have been opened are not acceptable. Applicants who have earned an Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, Baccalaureate, or higher degree from an accredited institution are waived from this requirement.
- Submission of all official, unopened (sealed) college transcripts from previously or currently enrolled colleges. Unofficial copies or official copies that have been opened are not acceptable.
- Completion of [placement testing](#) and all college preparatory work. Applicants who have credits earned in mathematics and/or composition may be waived from the placement test.
- If previously or currently enrolled at SPC, academically in good standing and have a cumulative 2.0 GPA.
- Standard (Scaled Score) of 95 on the Reading subsection of the Florida College Entry Level Placement Test, 510 SAT Verbal score, 22 ACT Reading score, or earn “C” or better in REA 1105, Critical Reading and Thinking, or **have earned a Master’s or higher degree from a regionally accredited institution.**
- Completion of 11 credits in the Nursing pre-entry general education and support courses with a 2.75 minimum grade point average on a 4.00 scale including PSY1012 General Psychology, [Basic Computer and Information Literacy Competency](#), BSC2085/2085L Human Anatomy and Physiology 1 and Lab and BSC 2086/2086L Human Anatomy and Physiology 2 and Lab.
- A 2.75 minimum grade point average on a 4.00 scale in the following courses that are being considered for admission: BSC 2085, BSC 2085L, BSC 2086, BSC 2086L, MCB 2010, and MCB 2010L.
- Minimum earned grades of “C” in all general education and support courses. (Excluding the computer competency) Students must complete the pre-entry science and support course requirements within three attempts.
- Submission of the [Selective Health Programs Application](#).

Within 90 days prior to the start of the first specialty course:

- Successful passing of a background check and drug screening.
- Completion of the Health Examination Form and any required immunizations.
- Completion of/attendance at the [Student Services Orientation](#) and the Nursing Orientation.
