Judge Irene Sullivan- Judge Irene Sullivan served 12 years as a juvenile and family court circuit judge in Pinellas County, handling cases of abandonment, abuse and neglect; delinquency, domestic violence and dissolution of marriage. Prior to that Judge Sullivan was a partner at Harris, Barrett, Mann and Dew in St. Petersburg, Fl. She had a civil trial practice in probate, employment and insurance defense. She is presently serving as a mediator and Guardian Ad Litem in high conflict divorce cases. She is an adjunct professor of law at Stetson University College of Law.

Judge Sullivan has received many awards, including the Salvation Army's Children's Justice Award, Judicial Appreciation awards from the St. Petersburg and Clearwater Bar Associations, the Ben C. Willard Award from Stetson University College of Law, and she was recently inducted into the law school's Hall of Fame.

Judge Sullivan serves as a trustee of the Pace Center for Girls, and a board member of the Pinellas County Community Foundation, the R Club, the Hispanic Outreach Center, the Center for Smart Justice, created under Florida Tax Watch and Ounce of Prevention Fund of Florida. She is also a member of the American Bar Association's Committee for Youth at Risk, the MacArthur Foundation's Models for Change Jidan (Juvenile Indigent Defense Action Network) Group, and the International Committee of the National Association for Juvenile and Family Court Judges.

Judge Sullivan is the author of *Raised by the Courts: One Judge's Insight into Juvenile Justice*, published by Kaplan Publishing Co. in November 2010.

Dr. Heide is a court qualified expert in psychology, criminology, adolescent homicide and parricide, child abuse, dysfunctional family, psychotherapy, personality assessment, mental health counseling and forensic evaluation. She is the recipient of six awards for teaching excellence including USF's prestigious award, the Jerome Krivanek Distinguished Teacher Award. Dr. Heide is the author/coauthor of three books, approximately 100 publications and 80 professional papers. Dr. Heide is a frequent consultant to national and electronic media in matters relating to juvenile crime to include *Newsweek*, *New York Times*, *U.S.A. Today*, *Psychology Today*, *Oprah magazine*, *Washington Post*, *Los Angeles Times*, *Chicago Tribune*, *Associated Press* and numerous international newspapers. As a recognized juvenile expert, Dr. Heide has appeared on Larry King Live, CNN, Good Morning America, Fox News and 20/20. Dr. Heide received her doctorate from University of Albany, State University of New York, School of Criminal Justice.

Dr. Heide is an auxiliary member of the United States Coast Guard. She is a certified coxswain, certified crew, certified instructor, certified aids to navigation verifier, active in search and rescue and port security operations. Dr. Heide is a Captain, OUPV Sea School graduate. Merchant Mariner Credential issued by the United States Coast Guard Maritime Center, November 7, 2011.

Chief Anthony Holloway - Anthony Holloway joined the Clearwater Police Department in 1985 as a patrol officer and earned a Bachelor of Arts degree (Business Management) in 1999 and his Master's degree (Business Administration) in 2001. In June of 2011, he was awarded a certificate of completion for the Senior Executives in State and Local Government program from Harvard University, Kennedy School of Government, Executive Education. During his career with the Clearwater Police Department, Chief Holloway served as a Patrol Officer, a Community Policing Specialist, an undercover Vice & Narcotics Detective, a Patrol Sergeant, a Detective Sergeant (Economic Crimes Unit), the Support Services Assistant Division Commander, and the Patrol Division Commander.

During Chief Holloway's tenure with the Clearwater Police Department, he received numerous awards to include the Clearwater Bar Association Allen L. Moore Memorial Gold Badge (twice), Kiwanis Club/Joseph F. Cornelius Family Foundation Outstanding Police Officer of the Year – the highest honor given by the Clearwater Police Department – Fraternal Order of Police Officer of the Year, Chief's Unit Citation, and numerous letters of commendation. Chief Holloway retired as the Patrol Division Commander in November 2007.

Upon Chief Holloway's retirement, he was selected as the Chief of Police (2007 – 2010) with the City of Somerville, Massachusetts. The city of Somerville is home to a myriad of immigrants from all over the world making it one of the most ethnically diverse cities in the nation.

Chief Holloway was reunited with the Clearwater Police Department in February 2010 having been appointed Chief of Police from a field of more than 200 candidates. The Clearwater Police Department is the third largest law enforcement agency in Pinellas County, with 231 sworn personnel, more than 98 full time civilian positions, and an annual budget of \$36.4 million. The Clearwater Police Department is a fully accredited agency with the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation, Inc. and is a national leader in the adaptation of computer technology to police work. The department has been in the forefront of addressing social problems and has been named one of the nation's safest cities.

Chief Holloway taught law enforcement to governmental, educational and community organizations throughout Florida. He also served as consultant/trainer to organizations such as the Department of Juvenile Justice, U. S. Department of Justice and St. Petersburg College.

Dwight Stewart- is a nationally-recognized presenter on gang violence and school safety issues. He is a Gang Specialist with the Texas School Safety Center, and former Detention Superintendent for the San Patricio County Juvenile Detention Center. Mr. Stewart is a Certified Officer Safety Trainer (Sam Houston State University), Nationally Certified Gang Awareness Trainer specializing in gangs K-12, Chinese Gangs, Military Gangs, and International Gangs (National Gang Crime Research Center, Chicago, IL), Bomb Awareness Trainer (New Mexico Tech), Certified Mediator (Austin, Texas Dispute Resolution Center and Incident Command Trainer with the Texas Gov. Department of Emergency Management. Mr. is a former Juvenile Boot camp Administrator, Juvenile Detention Assistant Administrator, Juvenile Probation Officer and State Parole Officer (SISP Unit) and has conducted numerous of school safety site assessments and specialized trainings on Gang Awareness, Bullying, and Conflict Resolution, Anger Management, Crises Management planning, and Indicators of Violent Behavior for individuals throughout Texas, Ohio, Georgia, Florida, Maryland, Kansas, Arizona, and Arkansas.

La'Tasha Atkins- is a Victim/Witness Assistance Coordinator for the Orleans Parish District Attorney's Office, in New Orleans, La. She serves as the Community Liaison for her office by providing a link to resources in the community for victims and witnesses to obtain services to help maintain and sustain a healthy environment. La'Tasha serves as a member of the Call-Out Response Team at the D.A.'s office, which is available 24/7 to assist with Homicide and Sex Crime cases. She is a former Mental Health Professional, working in Outpatient settings and with Louisiana Spirit-Hurricane Recovery, providing Crisis and Psycho-educational groups in the New Orleans and Charter schools systems for survivors of the 2005 hurricanes. Ms. Atkins attended and successfully completed training at the National Victim Assistance Academy in 2010. In May of 2011, Victims and Citizens Against Crime, Inc. presented Ms. Atkins with the Outstanding Victim/Witness Assistance Coordinator Award of the Year. La'Tasha holds a BA in Social Work from The University of Louisiana at Monroe and a Masters of Social Work from Southern University at New Orleans.

Ms. St John is a continual guest lecturer for the Florida Gang Investigator's Association and the Florida College of Advanced Judicial Studies. Ms. St John graduated from Stetson College of Law.

Dr. Gregory Robinson- is a nationally recognized Crime Prevention Practitioner. Dr. Robinson is a Captain with the Lakeland Police Department and Director of there crime prevention department. He has been honored with the Dr. Martin Luther King Man of the year award, City of Lakeland Outstanding Volunteer, Lakeland Police Civilian member of the year in 2007, awarded in 2009 the Crime Prevention Unit of the Year for the State of Florida, and in 2010 Dr Robinson was recognized by the Florida Crime Prevention Association as Practitioner of the year. Special Agent Baute has received numerous awards for his dedication and investigations of crimes against children. In 2010, Special Agent Baute was recognized by Florida Governor Charlie Crist and Florida Attorney General Bill McCollum for his service and dedication to child victims. Prior to the legislative merger of the Florida Attorney General's Office Child Predator Cyber Crime Unit with the Florida Department of Law Enforcement on July 1, 2011, Special Agent Baute served as the Lieutenant in charge of law enforcement operations for the Tampa Bureau of the Florida Attorney General's Office.
