

Updates to Student Affairs policies

Several changes to policies impacting students were made last fall. These policies include:

1. Students applying to college-credit programs will be listed as non-degree seeking and ineligible for financial assistance until the requirements below are completed:
 - a. Submission of an official high school transcript or GED showing graduation date.
 - b. Submission of official transcripts from all colleges previously attended.
 - c. Completion of the Computerized Placement Test (CPT), SAT, ACT or other approved instrument. Test scores are valid for two years. Transfer work from other colleges may satisfy part or all of this requirement. See an academic advisor for more details.
2. Effective the end of the fall 2007 term, academic standards of progress will be evaluated based on the initial college-level credit hours attempted. Previously, this evaluation occurred after a student completed seven credit hours.
3. Returning SPC students who have not enrolled in the last three terms must provide updated contact information before re-enrolling to ensure that the college has current contact and residency information.
