HEC Requirements

- Complete the [St. Petersburg College Admission Application](#) and pay the non-refundable fee.
***Note to Returning Students** If you have not enrolled in courses in the six previous semesters, you will need to complete the online [Readmission Application in MySPC](#). You will be asked if you want to complete the readmission process when you log in to MySPC. Failure to do so will prohibit or delay your course enrollment.
- Submit official, unopened (sealed) high school transcript(s) or GED transcripts. We do not accept unofficial copies or official copies that have been opened. Applicants who have earned an Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, Associate in Applied Science, Baccalaureate, or higher degree from a regionally accredited institution are waived from this requirement.
- Submit official, unopened (sealed) transcripts from all regionally accredited college(s) and/or universities currently or previously attended. We do not accept unofficial copies or official copies that have been opened. Note: Transcripts from schools outside of the U.S. must be evaluated by a NACES approved agency.
- Your Academic Standing can have an impact on your admission, enrollment, and financial aid eligibility. See the SPC [Academic Standing Policy](#) for details.

Program Requirements

- Be at least 18 years of age.

Selection Criteria

Preference will be given to students that demonstrate college level in Writing, Reading, and Math, either through appropriate test scores, or through appropriate course completion. When the number of eligible applicants exceeds the program availability, selection will be determined by lottery.

- **All application requirements must be satisfied by the close of the application window.**

If you are not offered admission, you will need to reapply during the next appropriate application acceptance period.

If you are offered admission you will need to complete the following pre-enrollment requirements by a specific due date to maintain eligible status.

- Complete the Letter of Intent survey (Provided in admission E-Mail)
- Complete the Health Education Program orientation. (Date provided in admission E-mail)
- Successfully pass a background check and drug screening. (Due date provided at the orientation)
- Complete the Health Examination (Physical) Form, all required vaccinations and proof of immunity (titers). (Form and due date provided at the orientation)
- Completion of BLS Provider from American Heart Association. (Due Date provided at the orientation)

Program Admission Statistics

Typically, 36 students are admitted to both the day and evening classes. We generally have between 90 and 120 applicants.

Evening Class (Begins in September, February and May)

- **Theory:** Mondays & Wednesdays 5:30 p.m. - 9:30 p.m. (weeks 7-16)
- **Labs:** Tuesdays & Thursdays 5:30 p.m. - 9 p.m. (weeks 7-16)
- **Clinicals:** You schedule your own clinicals during weeks 11-15. Your field internship takes place during weeks 1-6 of the following session.

Summer Schedule Only:

- **Theory:** Mondays & Wednesdays 5:30 p.m. - 9:30 p.m. (weeks 1-10)
- **Lab:** Tuesdays & Thursdays 5:30 p.m. - 9 p.m. (weeks 1-10)
- **Clinicals:** You schedule your own clinicals during weeks 11-15.
- **Field internship:** takes place during weeks 1-6 of the following session.
