HEC Requirements

- Complete the [St. Petersburg College Admission Application](#) and pay the non-refundable fee.
***Note to Returning Students** If you have not enrolled in courses in the six previous semesters, you will need to complete the online [Readmission Application in MySPC](#). You will be asked if you want to complete the readmission process when you log in to MySPC. Failure to do so will prohibit or delay your course enrollment.
- Submit official, unopened (sealed) high school transcript(s) or GED transcripts. We do not accept unofficial copies or official copies that have been opened. Applicants who have earned an Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, Associate in Applied Science, Baccalaureate, or higher degree from a regionally accredited institution are waived from this requirement.
- Submit official, unopened (sealed) transcripts from all regionally accredited colleges and/or universities .We do not accept unofficial copies or official copies that have been opened.
- Students must demonstrate they are at college level in Writing, Reading, and Math either through appropriate test scores, or through appropriate course completion.
- Students must have a cumulative 2.0 GPA.

Program Admissions

- Complete with grades of "C" or better :
 - BSC 2085 and BSC 2085L Human Anatomy & Physiology I and Lab
 - BSC 2086 and BSC 2086L Human Anatomy & Physiology II and Lab.
 - Computer/Information Literacy Competency
- Complete a minimum 12 credit hours in the general education and support courses of the [Respiratory Care curriculum](#) with grades of "C" or better. Must have a minimum 2.5 GPA in all pre entry, general education and support coursework.
- Submit the Health Programs Application: <https://web.spcollege.edu/hec/application/apply>

***All transcripts must be received and evaluated by St. Petersburg College at least 30 days prior to the application deadline to ensure consideration.*

Selection Criteria

Due to enrollment limitations, meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission. When the number of eligible applications exceeds the program availability, selective criteria will be used to determine which applicants will be offered admission. Students will be considered using a point system based on health program GPA, pre-entry, general education and support coursework completed, according to the following:

- **31** points may be awarded based on the number of health program pre-entry, general education and support coursework completed.
- **40** may be awarded based on the health program GPA (grades earned from pre entry, general education and support coursework. A grade of P will be assigned the value of the student's program GPA, excluding the computer competency).
- **All application requirements must be satisfied by the close of the application window.**

If you are not offered admission, you will need to reapply during the appropriate application acceptance period for your desired start date.

If you are offered admission you will need to complete the following pre-enrollment requirements by a specific due date to maintain eligible status.

- Complete the Letter of Intent survey (Provided in admission E-Mail)
- Successfully pass a [background check and drug screening](#). (Information and due date provided in Admission E-Mail)
- Complete the Health Examination Form and any required immunizations. (Form and due date provided at orientation)
- Complete the Health Education Program orientation. (Date provided in Admission E-Mail)

Program Admission Statistics

On average, approximately 60-70 students apply for admissions each application period. Of these, typically 29 are accepted. The average GPA for acceptance varies based on the pool of applicants, but typically falls between 3.4 and 3.6 with most courses completed.

Program Information

First Year: Mondays & Wednesdays from approximately 8 a.m.-2 p.m.

Second Year: Wednesdays from approximately 8 a.m.-2 p.m. Clinical rotations are on Mondays or Tuesdays from 6:45 a.m. - 12:45 p.m. or from 7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.

Summer: Between the 1st and 2nd year, students are in clinical rotations from 6:45 a.m.-2:45 p.m. on Thursdays and Fridays, and in class on Wednesdays from 8 a.m.-2 p.m. During the summer of the second year, students are in clinical rotations on Monday and Tuesdays from 6:45 a.m.-2:45 p.m. and in class on Wednesdays from 9 a.m. -2 p.m.

Ensuring Course Requirements are Satisfied

*It is the student’s responsibility to make sure transfer coursework meets the course requirements for SPC.

Courses that transfer in as “Elective” 1999, 2999, 3999 or 4999 prefix do not satisfy requirements. The student may request Alternate Satisfaction for the specific course to see if the course will meet the specific requirements.

Ex: If speech transfers in as: SPC 1999 it does not meet the requirement for speech. If an alternate satisfaction is requested and approved the speech requirement would be met.
