Will try to do one class running parallel online and classroom delivery. Utilizing Webcam & Podcast audio was suggested. • CGS 2811 Incident Response now utilizes a Forensics book. Because the upper division has a class that mirrors the management level policy that CGS 2811 incorporated, Kevin changed the class to be more technical and shows how cyber forensics can be used. • Interactive content in classes – Cyber Protect 1999 will be used in some courses. It is less involved than Cyber Ops Net Warrior 2009, which possibly can be used for more advanced classes.
