Call to Order	Meeting called to order at 9:10 a.m. by Dr. Kimberly Hartman, in Lou Cerreta's absence. Board members were asked to review the minutes from the last meeting. A request to correct the spelling of Diane Carlo's name. There were no other comments from the Board.
COE Updates	
Dr. Kim Hartman	Board members were asked to look at copies of the flyer for the new online ELED program. The program targets the Para to Professional program. The COE's 2 nd cohort is starting in fall. It features tuition that is less than half of the universities. Pinellas has committed to let Paras stay in their own classrooms.
Dr. Michael Poulin	Reiterated that the Ed Studies new interpreting track will roll out in August
Dr. Meg Delgato	Reminded to board that she is the Online ELED mentor. We admitted 10 for the spring. Dr. Delgato is their advocate/liaison, and troubleshoots for them. Out of the 10, all are staying in ELED, but one has decided to take some blended classes. The Secondary Science program in teach-out, but now all of the COE resources will go to Middle Grades Science which is going to an all online schedule.
Diane Carlo	Would current teachers be eligible for that program?
Dr. Meg Delgato	They could take coursework and sit for exam. Online could work to open avenues for those teachers. SPC will be doing a program refresh.
Dr. Michael Poulin	Depending on what the state requires we can offer coursework.
Dr. Meg Delgato	I wrote grant for lab lending kits for the online classes. That may help to get more people into Science Ed.
Updates from the School Districts	
Diane Carlo Hillsborough	NAEP results show Hillsborough County schools at the top for urban school districts. We are continuing to right-size budget. It is a challenge to hire new people in budget crunch, but we will get there. The path to move up in leadership is through high need schools. On June 19 th HR is holding teacher interviews for external candidates. Recommend preparing teacher candidates for poverty areas. That is where the need is.
Dr. Kim Hartman	We have made dedicated effort to place interns in high needs schools

Diane Carlo	Classroom management is getting more of a systematic approach. That is coming together. On a side note, Diane shared that she will be retiring in December.
Kim Newberry Pasco	Pasco County has a new middle school opening next year. Wendell Krinn Technical High School is also opening next year. The critical needs are in Science and Math. There was a job fair in March and we offered provisional contracts to interns who will work in poverty schools.
Dr. Kim Hartman	The Pinellas grow your own model is called the ELITE Educators program. Our first cohort is finishing this year.
William Aligood Pinellas	Pinellas is moving to a focus model evaluation plan that brings Marzano down to 23 elements. It goes to the board in May. The Springboard to Success is working on recruitment not just new hires but also for new 1 to 2 year teachers. It is a solid program and we have had great success.
Dr. Kim Hartman	Is it a paid program?
William Aligood	Yes, they are hired and paid for the 6 week program. Placement of interns – we are recruiting great teachers for Clinical Educator training. I will be participating in Equity and Restorative Practices training in Tallahassee. All schools will now have a licensed equity trainer.
Art Steulette	Preparing teachers for Marzano light (focus model). There is a training in Orlando in July. Marzano will be there. It uses condensed indicators and is simpler and easier. Our Interns are going well. Safety in schools – all Pinellas schools will have a resource officer. The question is what they will actually do all day. There are some kinks to work out, including how we will pay for them.
Dr. Kim Hartman	We can send ELED flyers to schools. They can be sent electronically to Hillsborough, Pasco, and Pinellas
Dr. Susan Weber	Is the COE embedding Marzano in courses?
Art Steulette	You already embed Marzano in your ELED courses.
Dr. Meg Delgato	Yes we do.
Dr. Kim Hartman	We can embed aspects in Ed Studies Preschool track.
Dr. Andrea Kelly	We are working on fine tuning the ED Studies Preschool track.
