SPC is piloting a common course start time this spring. The COE is making our courses blended so that students will have an opportunity to meet at least once a month with all four of their instructors.

	 Live Online teaching modality is our synchronous format. Students and Faculty like the format and the success rates have been good. We are planning to expand ELITE program to multiple districts. Pasco, Hernando, and some other outlying districts are interested. Our site visit has been pushed out to spring 2023.
