TUITION

Tuition Due Dates

Universal Due Date for Full Term, Weekend College and First 8 Week Session July 15
If your tuition is not received or if you have not been awarded financial aid by this date, the classes you have registered for will be removed from your schedule. You can re-register for classes on a space-available basis.

Financial Aid Awarded Date for FAS Due Date Extension July 15
You can still apply for financial aid after this date; however, you will need to make arrangements for tuition payments while your file is processed.

Second Due Date for Full Term, Weekend College and First 8 Week Session Aug. 5
If your tuition is not received or if you have not been awarded financial aid by this date, the classes you have registered for will be removed from your schedule. You can re-register for classes on a space-available basis.

Second Financial Aid Awarded Date for FAS Due Date Extension Aug. 5
You can still apply for financial aid after this date; however, you will need to make arrangements for tuition payments while your file is processed.

Due Date for Express Session Sept. 2

Due Date for Second 8 Week Session Sept. 30

FAS Due Date Extension Oct. 22
This extension is for students who are awarded a financial aid package by July 15 or Aug. 5. If your financial aid award does not cover the entire balance, you must pay your balance by this date. If you have an extended due date, you will not be dropped for non-payment by this date. You may continue in the class, but you will be billed for the amount owed. Future registration will not be available until the balance is paid in full.

Online enrollment begins. June 15
0% down payment with 4 monthly payments and \$35 enrollment fee (July – Oct.) June 29
25% down payment with 3 monthly payments and \$40 enrollment fee (Aug. – Oct.) July 23
50% down payment with 2 monthly payments and \$45 enrollment fee (Sept. & Oct.) Aug. 14
Last date to increase the payment plan agreement balance Aug. 14
Last date to decrease or terminate payment plan agreement balance Oct. 15

Online enrollment begins. Aug. 24
50% down payment with 1 monthly payment and \$45 enrollment fee (Oct. only.) Sept. 11

TOTAL WITHDRAWAL

Withdrawing from a class or all of your classes can have serious financial and academic consequences. There is a difference in withdrawing from ALL classes and withdrawing from A class. In most cases, the financial aid consequences listed below are a result of withdrawing from ALL classes. The academic (grade) consequences listed below are a result of withdrawing from A class. If you receive federal financial aid, withdrawing from all classes may require repayment of unearned funds. It can affect your Satisfactory Academic Progress status and future enrollment. In addition, eligibility for future financial aid can be affected, regardless of which school you attend. The date you withdraw from a class is also a factor in determining your grade for that class. If you have a balance due from dropping or withdrawing from a class or classes or withdrawing from all classes, you must pay that balance. You may be sent to collections for failure to repay. Before making changes to your enrollment, speak with a Financial Aid Counselor or an Academic Advisor to understand the impact of your decision. You must phone the SPC Call Center at 727-341-4772 as you are not able to totally withdraw from all classes through MySPC.

Last Date to Withdraw from All Classes with Federal Financial Aid Repayment

If you withdraw from all classes BEFORE or ON this date, you will need to repay all or part of your federal aid disbursed in that term. If you withdraw from a class BEFORE or ON this date, that class will be assigned a grade of “W.”

First 8 Week Session Sept. 17
Weekend College Oct. 20
Full Term Oct. 20
Express Session Nov. 1
Second 8 Week Session Nov. 12

Between Last Date to Withdraw from All Classes with Federal Financial Aid Repayment and Last Date to Withdraw from All Classes without Federal Financial Aid Repayment

If you withdraw from all of your classes BETWEEN these dates, you will NOT need to repay your federal aid disbursed in that term. If you withdraw from a class BETWEEN these dates, that class will be assigned a grade of “W.”

Last Date to Withdraw from All Classes without Federal Financial Aid Repayment

If you withdraw from all classes ON or AFTER this date, you will NOT need to repay your financial aid disbursed in that term. If you withdraw from a class ON or AFTER this date, that class will be assigned a grade of “WF,” which has the same impact on your GPA as an “F.”

Email All email notifications are sent to your MySPC student email
Students may forward their MySPC student email to a personal email.

Awarding Financial aid awarding occurs daily and email notifications are sent daily

Verification 14 working days from the receipt date of all required documentation
Once complete, the verification item(s) will be removed from your MySPC Action Items.

SAP Appeals 10 working days from the receipt date of all required documentation, email notifications are sent daily
Once a decision is made, the SAP item will be removed from your MySPC Action Items. To check your status, log in to Titan Hub, select MySPC, Financial Aid Status and the aid year. Look in the box in the top right-hand corner for your SAP status.

Students will be notified by email if, during peak processing times, the benchmarks above have been revised.
