SCHOLARSHIPS

St. Petersburg College awards about \$6 million in scholarships each year to deserving students. Scholarships include:

SPC INSTITUTIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Institutional scholarships are provided through the college or individual departments. Scholarships reward achievements and abilities such as athletics, performing arts, visual arts, and academic performance, just to name a few. Many are based on your financial need.

Johnnie Ruth Clarke Scholarship

This need-based scholarship honors the legacy of local educator and humanitarian Dr. Johnnie Ruth Clarke and is awarded to Pinellas County high school seniors with a 3.0 GPA or higher.

Presidential Scholarship

Pinellas County high school seniors with a 3.5 GPA or higher can qualify for this full-tuition scholarship.

FLORIDA BRIGHT FUTURES

These lottery-funded scholarships reward Florida high school graduates for high academic achievement. This scholarship program awards a fixed amount per credit hour for the fall and spring terms each academic year.

SPC FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

Each year, the St. Petersburg College Foundation awards SPC students close to \$2 million in scholarships through private gifts from generous individuals, community groups and businesses. You can earn these scholarships for academic achievement and community involvement, among other factors, and not all scholarships are based on financial need.

FUSE PROGRAM TRANSFER PLANS

Select Associate in Arts transfer plans may be offered through the FUSE program, our partnership with the University of South Florida System. The program guarantees admission into certain bachelor's degree programs for eligible students who complete their associate degree within 3 years at St. Petersburg College. FUSE students are granted access to USF System activities while a student at SPC. Once you apply, you will be able to meet with an dedicated FUSE advisor to determine eligibility.





CAREER OUTLOOK

Employment for computer and information technology occupations is projected to grow 12% nationally through 2024, faster than the average for all occupations. These occupations will add about 488,500 new jobs to the economy, for a total of 4.4 million jobs.

Occupations with the highest expected growth in Florida include computer systems analysts, software application developers and computer user support specialists. Best of all, you can train for all of these careers at SPC.

The median annual wage for computer and information technology occupations was \$79,390 in May 2014, which was higher than the median annual wage for all occupations of \$35,540.
