A secondary Health Program Application is required for limited access Health Programs. See link below.

- Submit official, unopened (sealed) high school or GED transcripts indicating completion of standard high school diploma or equivalency. We do not accept unofficial copies or official copies that have been opened. Applicants who have earned an Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, Associate in Applied Science, Baccalaureate, or higher degree from a regionally accredited institution are waived from this requirement. Transcripts must be received and evaluated by St. Petersburg College prior to the application deadline to ensure consideration. Submitting Official Transcripts
- Submit official, unopened (sealed) transcripts from all regionally accredited college(s) and/or universities currently or previously attended. We do not accept unofficial copies or official copies that have been opened. Transcripts must be received and evaluated by St. Petersburg College prior to the application deadline to ensure consideration. Submitting Official Transcripts
- Submit official transcripts showing completion of an Associate degree or higher from a regionally accredited institution.
 Transcripts must be received and evaluated by St. Petersburg College prior to the application deadline to ensure consideration. <u>Submitting Official Transcripts</u>
- □ Students must demonstrate they are at college level in Writing and Reading, either through appropriate test scores or through appropriate course completion.
- Students must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.00 on a 4.00 scale in all postsecondary coursework. Your Academic Standing may have an impact on your admission, enrollment, and financial aid eligibility. See the SPC Academic Standing Policy for details. <u>Academic Standing Policy</u>
- □ Read and acknowledge the Funeral Services Technical Standards (Essential Functions).
- Complete the following Support/Pre-Entry Courses with a minimum 2.5 GPA: <u>Support/Pre-Entry Courses</u>: (May <u>not</u> be satisfied by an Associate in Arts or higher degree)
 FSE 1000 - Introduction to Funeral Services (Included in competitive GPA)
 - FSE 2061 Thanatology (Included in competitive GPA)

- Please note that any combination of three unsuccessful attempts in FSE prefix courses will result in an ineligible application for admission or readmission to the program. Attempts include transfer credits, course substitutions, test credits, and SPC course withdrawals (WR not included in attempts).

Selection Criteria

Due to enrollment limitations, meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission. When the number of eligible applications exceeds program availability, selective criteria is used to determine which applicants are offered admission. This criterion is based on a point system using health program GPA, and completion of pre-entry, general education and support coursework, according to the following:

- 40 points may be awarded based on the GPA from the following courses: FSE 1000, FSE 2061, ACG
 2021 and BUL 2241. (Minimum 2.5 GPA required for consideration)
- A grade of P will be assigned the value of a student's cumulative GPA for selective admission GPA calculation purposes for this program, excluding the computer competency.
- All application requirements must be satisfied by the close of the application window.

Transfer Coursework

It is the student's responsibility to ensure transfer coursework meets SPC course requirements. Transfer courses for which there is no direct SPC equivalent will be posted as elective credit and designate with a '999' course number. If you believe a course posted as an elective should satisfy a degree requirement, you may submit a request for an Alternate Satisfaction. Before you begin completing the survey, be sure to have the following available:

- Course name and course number of the course taken at the former institution
- Official or unofficial copy of the transcript from the former institution to upload
- Syllabus of the course you completed and wish to use to satisfy an SPC course

Admissions Information

Admission status notifications will be sent through MySPC live student email (<u>xxxxx#@live.spcollege.edu</u>). If you are not sure how to access your SPC student email, please visit <u>How do I Access My SPC Email</u>.

If you are offered admission you will need to complete the following pre-enrollment requirements by a specific due date to maintain eligible status:

- Complete the Notice of Intent survey (Provided in Admission E-Mail)
- Successfully pass a <u>background screening</u>. (Information and due date provided in Admission E-Mail)
- Complete the Health Education and Program orientation. (Information and due date provided in Admission E-Mail)

Candidates on the Alternate list must follow instructions and deadlines in their notification to maintain eligibility for possible admission. If you are not moved from alternate to admitted, you will need to reapply during the next appropriate application period.

If you are not offered admission, you will need to reapply during the next appropriate application acceptance period.
