Program Information

Professional Practice III, HIM 2820, is an externship course requiring the student to be placed at an acute care or other health record setting. The course is in a sixteen-week blended format: the first three weeks are online, followed by 10 weeks at a facility, and then the last 3 weeks are online. For distance learners, there are authorized clinical facilities outside of Pinellas County. Please note that transportation will be required for travel up to 30 miles to your assigned facility.

➤ **Background and Drug Screening:** Prior to enrolling in this course, students must complete a background and drug screening and submit proof of immunizations. Students must contact the Program Director to be enrolled.

Transfer Coursework

Transfer courses for which there is no direct SPC equivalent will be posted as elective credit and designate with a '999' course number. If you believe a course posted as an elective should satisfy a degree requirement, you may submit a request for an Alternate Satisfaction. Experiential Learning Program (ELP)

Learners are able to use the <u>Experiential Learning Program</u> (ELP) to waive credits or to test out of classes in which they have experience. The ELP program does incur a small fee for each credit hour awarded and credit is awarded based on the evaluation of the assigned assessor.

Here are the instructions to initiate this process:

- Identify specific courses you would like to earn credit for. (NOTE: Some HEC courses are not eligible for ELP credit.) Review your degree progress report in MySPC and/or contact an academic advisor to clarify your program requirements.
- Complete the ELP application at https://web.spcollege.edu/survey/3077
- A designated SPC instructor will interview you to determine if an assessment will be performed.
- Submit any required documentation for the assessment and pay the ELP fee of \$25 per credit hour.
- The instructor evaluates the materials and determines if credit will be awarded.
- A notification is sent to you of the assessment outcome.
