Program Information and Schedule

- SPC's Respiratory Care program has been producing highly qualified RRTs since 1971.
- The Health Education Center offers an on-site simulation hospital for students to practice skills.
- One cohort is available each year: Fall
- Completion of the program allows a student to apply to SPC's B.S. Cardiopulmonary Science.
- Clinical facilities may prohibit students who do not have an assigned social security number from participating in clinical experiences which are a mandatory component of the curriculum.
 If other placement options are not available, the student would need to withdraw from that semester and would not be able to progress in the program. These factors must be taken into consideration prior to pursuing admission to the program.
- Year One Fall and Spring:
 - Mondays 8:00 a.m. 3:00 p.m. Clinicals every other Tuesday <u>or</u> Thursday 6:30 a.m. to 7 p.m. Lab on Thursdays (weeks 1 - 4)
- Year One Summer: Mondays 8:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.

Clinicals 6:30 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. up to two days per week, depending on clinical location

- Year Two Fall and Spring: Wednesdays 8:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.
 - Clinicals every Tuesday 6:30 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- Year Two Summer:
 - Mondays 8:00 a.m. 3:00 p.m.

Clinicals 6:30 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. up to two days per week, depending on clinical location

Selection Criteria, Selection Process and Admissions

- All application requirements must be satisfied by the closing of the application window.
- Up to 36 students are admitted depending on availability of clinical sites. Typically, 60-70 students apply.
- The average GPA for acceptance varies for each applicant pool but typically falls above 3.0.
- When the number of eligible applicants exceeds program availability, selective criteria are used to determine which applicants are admitted. In the case of a tie, a lottery will be used. This criterion is based on a point system using the pre-entry GPA and completion of pre-entry, general education, and support coursework. Students will be considered using a point system based on health program GPA, and the number of general education and support coursework credits completed.
- **31 points** may be awarded based on the number of health program pre-entry, general education and support coursework credits completed.
- **40 points** may be awarded based on the health program GPA earned from pre-entry, general education, and support coursework, excluding Computer/Information Literacy.

If you are admitted, you will need to complete the following pre-enrollment requirements to maintain eligible status.

- Complete the Notice of Intent survey by the date indicated in the admission email.
- Successfully pass a background check and drug screening by the date indicated in the admission email.
- Complete the Health Education Program orientation on the date indicated in the admission email.
- Complete the Health Examination Form and any required immunizations. Form and due date will be provided at orientation.

If you are not admitted, please discuss admissions requirements with an Academic Advisor and consider reapplying during a future application cycle.
