## Old Business

Reviewed and Approved November 5, 2019 minutes – Moved to approve was made by Laurie Rankin and seconded by Dr. Barbara Lewis.

## New Business

- Monica Roberts, Career Outreach Specialist for Health Sciences and Vet Tech shared the objectives of our Career Outreach Services department and discussed/demonstrated our College-wide virtual posting systems for SPC students, alumni, and potential employers- Hire SPC Titans (STPE.CO/HIRESPCTITANS). - Dr. Grey provided a summary of:
  - Spring, Summer, and Fall Semesters When the college closed on March 18,2020, all Vet Tech Courses moved to online. Due to the quick closer and still provide students the opportunity for synchronous learner a new platform was created called Live-on-Line. Live-on-Line provides students a real time virtual classroom using Zoom. This seems to be a modality that will become a permanent option for SPC and we continue to meet the needs of our students.

The most student impact was in the completion of our Labs where students are required to demonstrate their skills. Vet Tech was the first program to bring students back to campus. There was a lot of planning involved with significant health protocols put in place but overall the campus come back was successful. Over several weeks, we first

brought back the Seniors to complete their skills so they could graduate and move on Then we brought 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> semester students back. This included arranging with the large animal sites to accommodate our students. There were also extra sessions created so online students who were having difficulties could finding sites could complete their skills. Advisory Board Student Representatives Emily Scarborough and Kimberly Leshko shared how well they thought the process was handled.

Fall semester seems to be going well. There of course were some minor re-opening issues. Probably the biggest issue is having to remind students to stay socially distanced. The students are definitely doing a great job in adapting to the 'new now'. We currently only have our Labs on campus, with the majority of the lecture classes delivered online.

- Shared the responsibilities of our Clinical Coordinator, Ms. Debbie Raines. She oversees the Clinical Placements and handles all the monitoring of the clinical sights and AAs. During this time, she has done a great job in working with students to help them find clinics. Debbie has done wonders with coordinating everything associated with our clinical hour requirements. - Vet Tech will participate in the Health Centers Virtual Open House on October 15<sup>th</sup> starting at 5:30 p.m. <u>https://www.spcollege.edu/events/virtual-open-house-for-health-science-and-veterinary-programs</u>
- BAS Update: Instituted the new program changes. Last Spring the new Capstone Practicum was launched. Students are excited about the possibilities, but nervous about the process. The first cohort were delighted with the results and opportunity for a new experience. We received a great letter from a student who shared that her Practicum opened up the door to a new career (with increased pay) as the practice manager of a new not for profit clinic.
- Trish Gorham provided a review of:
  - Results of our AS students' graduation survey. This included a discussion of students who identified they were employed or not employed and looking.
    Although this is an anonymous survey, Trish and Debbie Raines are working to see how in the future we might be able to identify students who not employed but looking so we can hopeful help in their job search.

- VTNE Scores These results for the last testing period were very positive (please see attached). All domains for both campus and online were above the national average except for online Surgical Nursing. This is a positive trend. We believe that this might be associated with our switch to VetTechPrep, which our students are provided free as part of an SPC grant
- Program Milestones Targeted more specific areas for improvement (Please see attached) such as working to increase success rates by targeting struggling students and offering/requiring virtual tutoring sessions.
- Zimbabwe Study Abroad Trip. Unfortunately, our Namibia trip last May was canceled due to COVID. We are hopeful that this May 2021 trip will be able to go.
