Associate in Science Degree in Nursing (ASN) options at SPC

SPC offers several options for completing the ASN degree so you can choose the one that best fits your lifestyle:

1. Traditional ASN—morning theory schedule

- Four semesters with summer off (2 calendar years).
- Theory classes start at 8am (1-3 days per week + online courses).
- Simulation 1 day per week (usually 7am-1:30pm).
- Clinical will be 1 day (M-F, varies) from 6:30am to approx. 4:30pm (10 hours).
- Fall/Spring admission.

2. Traditional ASN—afternoon theory schedule

- Four consecutive semesters with classes during summer (17 months).
- Theory classes start during the afternoon (time varies)—1-3 days per week + online courses.
- Simulation 1 day per week (usually 1:30 to 8pm).
- Clinical will be 1 day (M-F, varies) from 6:30am to approx. 4:30pm (10 hours) in fall and spring, 6:30am to 6:30pm during the summer semester (12 hours).
- Fall/Spring admission.

3. Traditional ASN--Evening/weekend ASN track

- Six consecutive semesters with classes during summer (2 years).
- Theory classes 2 evenings per week (M-F, days vary). Students must be available 5-10pm. Some courses will be online.
- Simulation 1-2 evenings per week depending on the semester. 1 clinical day on the weekend from 6:30am to approx. 4:30pm (10 hours) in fall and spring, 6:30am to 6:30pm during the summer semester (12 hours).
- Fall admission only.

4. LPN-RN Bridge Track (Day theory schedule with weekday clinical)

This is for students who have completed their LPN at an accredited school and hold a valid LPN license in the State of Florida.

- Three semesters with summer off.
- Theory classes during the week (mix of morning and afternoon)
- Simulation 1 day per week. One clinical day during the week (M-F, varies) from 6:30am to approx. 4:30pm (10 hours).
- Fall admission only.

5. LPN-RN Bridge Track (Evening classes with weekend clinical)

This is for students who have completed their LPN at an accredited school and hold a valid LPN license in the State of Florida.

- Three semesters with summer off.
- Theory classes 2 evenings per week (M-F, days vary). Students must be available 5-10pm. Some courses will be online.
- Simulation 1-2 evenings per week depending on the semester. 1 clinical day on the weekend from 6:30am to approx. 4:30pm (10 hours)
- Spring admission only
