	previously experienced as large a drop in enrollment as other	
	sites, therefore, the percentage increase was not as large.	
	Classes are currently 90% full. The BAS program has the	
	largest number of students, followed by Workforce (AS, Cert,	
	Academy) students. It was noted that agencies now have	
	additional funds for tuition reimbursement which is reflected	
	in increased enrollment at Allstate.
