Before You Withdraw:

- Talk to an academic advisor or financial aid counselor
- Consider how a withdrawal may impact your financial aid eligiblity
- Review the deadline dates for withdrawal and refunds

- Withdrawing before 60% of the term is completed may require you to repay part of your financial aid.

- If you are enrolled in courses that do not span the full term, you are considered modularly enrolled.
- You must successfully complete at least one modular course or remain enrolled to avoid full withdrawal status.
- A "W/ WF/ WR/ F OR I" grade counts as a withdrawal and may impact your aid.
- Return of Title IV (R2T4) Policy
- If you withdraw from all courses, SPC will calculate how much aid you earned vs. how much must be returned.
- If you attended less than 60% of the term, you might have to repay unearned financial aid.
- No Show & Active Participation Policy
- If you do not attend during the first week, you will be dropped without financial liability.
- Students not actively participating may be withdrawn by instructors.
- No Show students are ineligible for financial aid for those courses.

What Happens to Your Financial Aid?

Scenario	Impact on Financial Aid
Withdrawing before 60% of term	May owe unearned aid repayment
Withdrawing from a modular course	May trigger R2T4 calculation if no successful completion
Receiving a W,WF,WR,F or I grade	Can be considered a withdrawal for aid purposes
Actively participating in course pass 60% of term	Keep 100% of your aid

Steps to Withdraw

- 1. Log in to MySPC to start the withdrawal process.
- 2. Meet with an Academic Advisor to discuss how withdrawal affects your degree plan.
- 3. Speak with a Financial Aid Counselor to understand the financial impact.
- 4. Check withdrawal deadlines to avoid unnecessary financial penalties.
- 5. Complete Student Loan Exit Counseling, if applicable.
